Schools remained open in spite of low attendance due to fears of the parents for their children, and absenteeism of some faculty members and health care workers due to infections, or the need to care for family members who were ill. The situation has improved in recent weeks, and the schools are holding their promotion ceremonies during the month of December.

To you, our donors and friends, we send heartfelt gratitude for continuing to send your generous donations, even when we did not physically travel to Nicaragua.
